

Due to the Christmas Eve service being canceled, we thought you may enjoy reading Pastor Gordy's sermon he had written for that night. Enjoy!

Tonight, in Christmas Eve, we gather to remember and give thanks to God for the birth of Jesus, the Christ. We envision the oxen and sheep standing nearby, the smell of hay with mice scurrying under it, and Jesus, wrapped in swaddling cloths, being laid on a manger, carved out of stone, not wood.

On our recent trip to the holy land our guide took us to Manger Square, better known as the church of the nativity. our guide showed us a series of caves that were behind the place of Jesus' birth where the sheep and oxen would have been corralled. It was amazing to touch that rock hewn manger, realizing the child who once laid there, would grow up to know life in its every dimension, including betrayal, fear, and death. Manger Square is usually teeming with thousands of people from all over the globe. When we were there, we heard very little English, instead we heard people speaking, often praying in polish, German, Italian, South Africa, as well south America and other places in Africa.

This Christmas, Manger Square is basically empty because of the ongoing wars in this area. It struck me that the conditions in our world concerning war, regional conflicts, political unrest, people in so many areas lacking food, medical facilities and educational opportunities remain, much as they were when this baby lay in Mary's arms. But much has also changed. for the message of Jesus, his life showing us what a truly human life looks like, full of love and generosity towards all peoples, continues to help his followers shine as lights in the darkness of this world. And so, just as people throughout the generations, it is this birth that continues to empower us to go on. What I am saying is that, even in the midst of the chaos and uncertainties of our world, even in the midst of all of our scientific know-how, that this birth and this child remains so very close to us. How, through this ancient story, he still is able to reach out to touch our hearts and fill us with peace and hope. Perhaps even joy!

Why is that? Why, after all these years and all the sermons preached this night. Why, after all the wars and terrible things life throws our way, do we continue to place so much emphasis on his birth? My intuition tells me the reason Jesus' birth continues to touch us, is because his birth reveals so much about the character of God.

From the beginning of human history people have wondered about God. Does God exist? If so, what is God like? is there one God or many Gods? does God care about what happens to me? The answer of all religions is that, yes, a God, or more than likely, many Gods, exist. Just by looking at the complexities of the universe we live in and the marvel of life, people have deduced that there has to be a power or powers at work, far greater than I am. As to the question for many, does God care about me, the answer was, "not really! But if you hope to get your 'Gods" to even notice you, you better show up at the temple with the right sacrifice!

Jesus' birth changed all that. Luke tells us, tells us that when the time was fulfilled, God chose to make himself known to us in the person of his son. and our God, chose to come to us not in arrogance and power, not in a way that would frighten or disturb us, but as a baby! A baby, who when grown to be a man, lived out his call to live a life of compassion and acceptance where every person, especially those who felt excluded or ashamed of their very being were told that they were known and loved by God.

It is important to remember that we celebrate the birth of Jesus because after his death, God raised him back to life. He still bore the marks of where the nails pierced his wrists and ankles and where the spear penetrated his side. when he first appeared to Mary Magdalene and later the disciples his first words were, "do not be afraid; peace be with you." it was the same Jesus they had traveled with all those years. through our Lord's death and resurrection God is telling us many things. Jesus sent out his Apostle's to announce the wondrous news that through his death, we have been made right with God, our sins have been removed from us. Also, to proclaim the fact that death will not hold us anymore than it held Jesus.

Saint Godric, a hermit who lived to be 105 in Scotland during the 6th century, and whose life was chronicled by a priest who wrote his life story said. "When we enter eternal life, we will realize that all the death in the world, compared to life we will enter, wouldn't fill a single teacup."

The message of Christmas is this. god exists. god is a god of unrelenting love. No matter who you are, no matter where you are on your journey of faith, the message is the same.

Christ the child was born for you, born to reveal on love of God for you. Let this truth possess and affirm you. Now, have a blessed Christmas. Thanks be to God. Amen.


