

The well known phrase, "It takes a village" is familiar to most of you. When I think of how it applies to all of you in Mooreton & Faith, my mind is flooded with examples. It can involve talents that are seen such as music, teach-

Several years ago, at a lecture series for preaching in Lent, the presenter, Pastor Susan Briehl, offered a new to me image for symbolizing the Sundays *in* Lent. She invited us to see the baptismal font as an oasis in the desert that we are refreshed by each week in worship as we come to these nourishing, cleansing, healing, and renewing waters of grace and new life.

This image stands in stark contrast to the frequent depictions of Lent as barren, dry, and sparce. Yet it is precisely in this season of self-examination, repentance, and recommitment to the spiritual practices of discipleship that we need the lush refreshment of life-giving baptismal waters. For the parched and weary in this season, returning to these waters in worship, we are given a sensorial experience of God's healing grace.

From the early centuries of the church, Lent was a time for instruction in the faith and preparation for baptism at Easter. In an echo of this tradition, we often during Lent return to the basics of our faith, to the teachings in Martin Luther's *Small Catechism* on the Ten Commandments, the Creed, the Lord's Prayer, and the sacraments. Upon completing this little book Martin Luther himself said he could spend a lifetime studying it and still have more to learn. Often our deepest learnings and discoveries are not in the complicated and complex, but in returning to the foundation, the core elements of our faith as relationship with God and neighbor.

Like our pilgrimage through Lent, this interim season is also a time for returning to the core of who we are as individuals and as a community of faith. Washed in the cleansing waters of baptism and sent as Spirit-filled people of God to a hurting and hungry world, we can in this time discern anew what this call and sending mean for us in our life-together as communities of faith. Three questions to help guide this discernment:

What are we doing well that we are called to continue doing? What new thing is the Spirit calling us to try? What have we been doing that the Spirit is no longer calling us to do?


Through this wandering, discerning, and discovery, when the possibility for new life looks as impossible as Sarah and Abraham to conceive and bear life, we are given a lush oasis in baptismal waters, covenant promises, and a meal of grace and joy. The word Lent comes after all from the German word for Spring. New life is coming. The barren branches are already budding with hope and promise. Indeed, a lush oasis awaits even in the wilderness.

Holy Saturday




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Saturday before Easter. Observes the day Jesus was in the tomb. This is a day of somber reflection, reflecting on what we'd miss in a world without Jesus.
